How much does it cost to register?

Foals (3 & 4 year olds) \$105

Shetland (5 & 6 year olds) \$135

Pinto (7 & 8 year olds) \$155

Mustang (9 & 10 year olds) \$225

Bronco (11 & 12 year olds) \$225

PONY (13 & 14 year olds) \$245

When are games played?

Foals: Tuesday and Thursday 5-5:45

Shetland: Tuesday and Thursday 6-6:45

Pinto: Monday and Wednesday 5:30-7:00

Mustang: Games are generally played on Tuesday and Thursday

Bronco: Games are generally played on Mondays and Wednesdays

PONY: Games are generally played on Mondays *through* Thursdays

When are practices?

Practices are up to the coaches and team. Typically, Foals will not have a practice, Shetland practices 1x/week and Pinto practices 2x/week. Higher levels general practice more frequently.

Where are games?

All games are played at Abbott Loop Community Park ball fields on Elmore Rd. These fields are built and maintained by Far North. Practice locations will be up to coaches.

How long is the season?

Field Clean Up Day: May 4th (weather dependent)

This is a day when all players and families are invited and encouraged to come out to the fields and help prepare them for the season.

Opening Ceremonies: May 11th

Opening Ceremonies is a really fun day with the presentation of teams and players, BBQ, bounce houses and games for the kids. We also have a silent auction to help raise money for the league.

Games begin May 13th. Foals and Shetlands will play their last games on July 18th. All other divisions will finish July 25th.

What equipment is required?

The league provides jerseys and hats to all players. The rest of the uniform is the player's responsibility (pants, cleats, etc.) Foals should wear comfortable pants and athletic shoes. Cleats are optional for Shetlands. Players also provide their own glove. Bats and helmets are provided by the league.

What is 'introductory t-ball'/Foal division?

This division is new for Far North this year but we are excited to include our youngest ball players! T-ball will be split up into Foal (3 and 4 year olds) and Shetland (5 and 6 year olds). This will allow a better skill development program going into Pinto (7 and 8 year olds.) Foals will play what is called 'Blast Ball.' The game will play to 1st base where players will step on the base after they've hit the ball and it will make a honking noise. The focus will be on hitting a ball off a tee, running to 1st base after hitting the ball, and catching and throwing a ball.
